FOX FACTS

- Foxes are generally nocturnal (they move around at night). However, you sometimes see them by day, especially in winter.
- In January or February, a litter of 4 or 5 cubs are born in a den or 'earth' underground. These earths are often rabbit burrows or badger sets that the fox has taken over.
- The cubs are blind and helpless at birth. They will not leave the den for at least three weeks.
- A fox's tail is called a brush.
